



What is the brief history of Norwell?

Take one look at the Norwell Town Seal and you find a brief history of our town: Scituate 1636; South Scituate 1849;

and Norwell 1888.

Th in Sa Ste Ste

The lands in Norwell were first settled in 1634 as a part of the settlement of Satuit (later Scituate) by Cornet Robert Stetson and his wife Honour Tucker

Stetson. They were granted extensive

lands on the North River--some of which include the Stetson Meadows conservation area and the townowned Stetson-Ford house. cor•net (kôr net') n. an old English military rank that refers to the flag bearer of a light horse, non-artillery military unit.

In 1849 the southern portion broke away from Scituate and incorporated

itself as South Scituate. Later, in 1888, the town was renamed Norwell.

coast•ing (kōst'ing) *n*. the carriage of goods or passengers by ship from one place to another

The Town Seal also tells of the importance of boat building in Norwell. The boat in the seal (a "pinkie") was used in the fishing and coasting trade, and many pinkies were built on the North River.

There are records of 1,025 craft being built on the North River. The greatest year was in 1801 when 30

vessels were launched. The cost to build a ship in New England was half the cost of building one in England and the

trees along the North River were abundant. Among the most famous ships built on the river was the Columbia, America's first ship to circumnavigate the globe.

Norwell was named for Henry Norwell, a wealthy Boston dry goods merchant and summer resident of the town, who provided funds for the maintenance of the roads. Other names considered for the town in 1888 were Deane, Hatherly,



What could have been!

Cushing, and Standish. A vote was called and the name Norwell got 215 votes, while the others got 2 each!

Norwell also has a long history of farming. In fact until the 1930s, almost all residents grew much of their own food. Even doctors, lawyers, landlords, and other business people tended a family farm for their personal crops and livestock.

The poultry business in Norwell was so lively in 1919 that "poultry stealing" was a serious matter in the district. Local chicken farmers were in constant danger of heavy loss, so they asked the Commonwealth to consider Norwell for the location of a State Police barracks. A station opened in what is now Drum's Emporium, but in a short time the force was increased to five men and the citizens felt that a strong protective arm was at hand! In 1923, a temporary building was erected to house the troops, and in 1935, the Commonwealth built the current State Police barracks.

Today, Norwell is less known for its shipbuilding and chicken farming and more for its excellent school system and unspoiled beauty.

How does the Norwell Historical Commission protect our history?

Local Historical Commissions have certain tools at their disposal to preserve history. The following chart shows typical means for historic preservation and how towns in our area practice them:

DEMOLITION-DELAY BY-LAW

Over 100 towns in Massachusetts have now passed a demolition delay by-law. With this by-law, the demolition of an *historically significant property* (see box on page 10) can be delayed while alternatives to the destruction of the building or structure are explored.

Norwell's Demolition Delay By-Law requires that applications to demolish buildings must be reviewed by the Historical Commission. Currently, the Commission can require a

6-month delay of any property listed in our survey of historically-significant properties (partial list beginning on page 16).

Throughout Massachusetts, we are losing historically sig-

nificant properties at a very high rate because of a shortage of buildable land. If an old house sits on a large tract of land, it is a prime target for developers looking to build new homes.

Christopher Skelly, director of local government programs for the Massachusetts Historical Commission, said "Many communities have found the 6-month delay inadequate." Developers have become accustomed to dealing with the 6-month by law. As their

ing with the 6-month by-law. As their projects become more complex and require more permitting, the 6-month time frame becomes meaningless. A longer delay could cause the developers to take a much closer look at an historic building; as a result, they might decide not to purchase it or they might decide to incorporate it into their plans.

The Norwell Historical Commission would like to increase the current by-law to a 12-month delay. The 12-month Demolition Delay By-Law is not aimed at stopping development; its purpose is to give developers and the town more time to find alternatives to demolition.



This historic cape on Mount Blue Street (The Dwelley-Clapp House, circa 1760) is gone forever. It was demolished in 2007 after the Historical Commission made the developer wait the requisite six months. The house sat on 25 acres and the developer found it inconvenient to relocate the home within the new proposed cul-de-sac.

The historic Bailey house **(below right)** on Route 53 in Norwell was sold in 2006. Although in need of a paint job on the outside, the inside maintained much of its historic character. Because of the Demolition Delay

By-Law, the developer investigated alternatives to tearing down the home. Thankfully the developer had patience and 12-months later a buyer was found and the house was dismantled and re-assembled in Maine. The house was saved, but Norwell's history was not. A new strip mall now occupies the site.






The Damon House (left), circa 1707, was demolished in 2007. The developer razed the tree-lined historic vista as well as the antique Cape to make way for a much larger, new home.

SCENIC ROADS

In 1976, Norwell designated our first scenic roads: Bowker Street, Norwell Avenue, Stetson Road, Tiffany Road and Jacobs Lane. Subsequent town meetings have added more, and Norwell now has twenty roads protected.

What makes a road a "scenic road"? The general laws of Massachusetts (Chapter 40, section 15C) provide that a

town's Planning Board, Conservation Commission or Historical Commission can initiate the designation process to make any road (other than a numbered route or state highway) a scenic road.





SCENIC ROADS, cont'd

When a road is deemed "scenic," its historic beauty is protected. Any repair, maintenance, reconstruction or paving work done with respect to the road shall not involve or include the cutting down or removal of trees or the tearing down or destruction of stone walls (or portions thereof) **except** with the prior written consent of the Planning Board and the Tree Warden.

While it is difficult to imagine, there is a thriving business in the purchase and relocation of stone walls. Such activities in or on the twenty streets designated as scenic roads in Norwell would be illegal without review.

In the future, the Historical Commission intends to place special signs on scenic roads to remind us that they are entitled to the preservation protection described above.

There are three more roads that the Historical Commission would like to see designated "Scenic Roads": Cross Street, Forest Street and Summer Street. We also support a Scenic Roads By-Law which will establish an orderly framework for the administration of this process.

HISTORIC DISTRICTS

Most people assume that the Norwell Historical Commission regulates exterior changes to antique homes and buildings.



In fact, only a <u>Local</u> Historic District Commission can enforce such rules and there are currently no Local Historic Districts nor Local Historic District Commissions in Norwell.

What about Norwell Center? It has an Historic District sign. Norwell's Town Center is a National Register Historic Area, NOT a local historic district.

HISTORIC DISTRICTS, cont'd

A National Register Area is part of the National Register of Historic Places, which is a list of individual buildings, sites, structures, objects, <u>and</u> districts that are deemed important in American history. If there is no state or federal involvement in a project (such as federal licenses, permits, or funding), then having a National Register Historic Area <u>does not in any way limit an owner's handling of the property</u>. It is, essentially, an honorary title only.

The Norwell Historical Commission hopes that future preservation planning will include the establishment of <u>Local Historic Districts</u> to protect historic resources from demolition, loss of integrity and decay, and to preserve and enhance Norwell's heritage.





These homes on Main Street (above) and on River Street (below) all have significant acreage--enough for multiple homesites, a small cul-de-sac, or a 40(B) project. Without a Local Historic District in place, each of these homes might be in danger of demolition if sold--the developer would only have to wait the requisite six months.






The Norwell Historical Commission & The Norwell Historical Society How do they differ?

The Historical **Commission** is an appointed town board whose duty is to protect and preserve the historical integrity of the town.

The Historical **Society** is a private membership organization that works to preserve the artifacts related to the history of Norwell. It maintains the Society Library at the Middle School, oversees the artifacts at the Jacobs

Farmhouse, and houses and catalogs historic documents on the $3^{\rm rd}$ floor of Sparrell School.

What do we go from here?

THE HISTORICAL COMMISSION RECOMMENDS...

... the following steps be taken to preserve Norwell's historical integrity:

- Pass a 12-month Demolition Delay By-Law at 2008 Town Meeting.
- Pass the final phase of Scenic Roads (Cross Street, Forest Street and Summer Street) at 2008 Town Meeting.
- Pass the Scenic Roads By-Law at 2008 Town Meeting.
- Within the next two years, create Local Historic Districts in the Town Center and on High Street.
- Review next areas for Local Historic District consideration.

- 1) Attend Town Meetings--support a stronger Demolition Delay
 By-Law and the Scenic Roads proposals and note that none of
 these proposals require any funding!
